Curriculum- ELA

FSA:

- Statewide Test
- Third grade is the first year for possible retention (next slide)

I-Ready:

- Use i-Ready textbooks to teach the standards. I will send home for you to review!
- Allows students to become accustomed to rigorous material and vocabulary.
- Lessons will adjust based on their scores on each Diagnostic. Important to try their best!

In Class:

- Novel Studies
- Spelling Quiz with dictation sentence will be combined with Vocab/Grammar for ONE total grade!
- Cold Read tests given when standard has been taught completely to show mastery

Cold Reads will be difficult at first as students adjust. 3rd grade is rigorous from the start to ensure our students master their standards.

FSA- Florida Standards Assessment

- FSA/Alternative Assessments:
- PAPER BASED TESTING for both Reading & Math!
- Portfolio Assessments
 – happens over a period of months by completing projects. Each task has a specific rubric for us to score.
- i-Ready Diagnostic #3 (April/May): score of 535 or higher in ELA. Level 1 & 2 will be placed on possible retention list in 4th quarter.
- **SAT10** is given at the end of the year an alternative to be promoted for those students who scored a Level 1.


- Target score- We would like to encourage students to consistently score a level 3 or above. (Highest level is 5).
- Retention Concerns would be Level
 1 and lower Level 2s.
- Please encourage reading from the very beginning of the year. This will help us to assist students in reaching their goals!

Accelerated Reader (A.R.)

- •STAR test every quarter to determine ZPD level (grade equivalent reading level)
- Students may take AR quizzes as they finish books to earn points towards their goal
- Students can take quizzes after novel study completion.
- Goal Tracker (Explain wall!)

•2 Grades for AR:


- 1 Grade for Comprehension and 1 Grade for % of Goal met
- Will be inputted at halfway mark for interims and updated at end of quarter with final grade

STEM lab is a Special -Practicing Engineering and thinking outside of the box to solve a problem ©





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AR Log In = student username and password



General Reminders

School-Wide Expectations = all starts with RESPECT

Supplies = be prepared, no dropping off materials/work in front office.

Study Skills = study, i-Ready, StemScopes (science), Vocabulary & Spelling.

Assignments = be timely, points deducted daily

PROCEDURES

- <u>Agendas and Folders:</u> Please view daily and initial! Look for papers daily.
- Please sign and return any papers on the "Sign and Return" side. Keep the rest.
- Bathroom Our class has a bathroom that is shared with another third grade class. Students are allowed to go to the bathroom during independent work without asking. However, I ask that students refrain from going to the restroom while I am teaching-unless it's an emergency. If your child needs to use the restroom frequently for medical reasons, please send a doctor's note.

PROCEDURES Continued

- Water- Water bottles are <u>not</u> permitted on desk tops (only during snack time).
- Snacks- Students will have a working, 10-15 minute snack daily, between 9:30-9:40am. Please send a healthy snack.

Administration does not allow:

- Gummies
- Potato chips
- Candy

Classroom Incentives

Individual Rewards

- -Behavior clips can move up and down. Marked in agenda.
- -Tickets are earned randomly for good behavior, finishing work on time, getting <u>agenda signed</u> <u>daily from parent, etc.</u>
- -When a student has earned 25 tickets they may cash them in for a Treasure box item. (donations are welcomed)
- -Kite Cash-Also for good behavior. These be used to buy items from the Kite Cash store.
- -Stickers & Verbal Praise.

Whole Class Rewards

-Links are earned for good behavior in the hallway, cafeteria, class with substitute, or any other praise (compliments) from an adult. After 30 links we will have a popsicle or ice cream celebration during recess.

Small Group Reward

-Students get table points. The table with the highest points at end of week earns a trip to the treasure box.

<u>Homework</u>

Although we have a "no homework" policy, students <u>may</u> <u>need</u> to do any of the following at home:

- * Unfinished classwork
- *Work sent home for reinforcement
- *Spelling Words and Vocabulary words
- *Website activities
- *iReady (45 minutes a week for both Reading & Math)
- *Math Worksheet.
